- 4. What was your first reaction to this book did it draw you in at once or did it take a while to become accustomed to the unusual tone?
- 5. How well do you think it dealt with the subject of alcoholism and its effect on the family unit?
- 6. Has our attitude to alcohol changed since that time?
- 7. Did it make you think about women's lives in the 1960s and 1970s and how much has changed in this regard?
- 8. How did the structure of the book work for you?
- 9. Tatty has a sister with 'special needs'. How do you think this affected the family? And how well did the author deal with this situation?
- 10. Which character did you relate to most and what do you think connected you to him/her?
- 11. If you could hear the story from another character's point of view, who would that be?
- 12.If you could ask the author one question what would it be?
- 13. What did you think of the length of the book? Was it too short or did it end in the right place? Did you like the ending?
- 14. How well did you think the author captured the era i.e. Dublin in the 1960s and 1970s?
- 15. Have you read any other books with a similar subject matter i.e. the effect of alcoholism on the family, living with a child with special needs?
